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**Students who are bullied are:**

- twice as likely to suffer from anxiety, depression, and other health issues.
- more likely to report high levels of suicide-related behavior.

**Students that bully are:**

- at greater risk for academic problems, substance use, and violent behavior, both now and later in life.

**What you can do:**

- Take a stand! More than half of bullying situations end when a peer intervenes.
- Start a program! Schools with bully prevention programs can reduce bullying by **25%!**
- Get everyone involved! Effective bully prevention involves everyone - students, parents, teachers, and community members.

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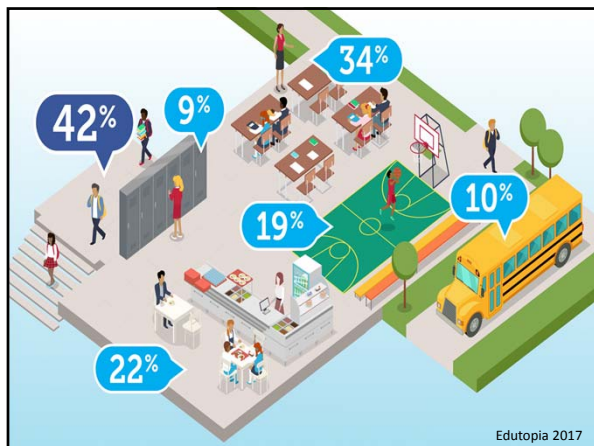
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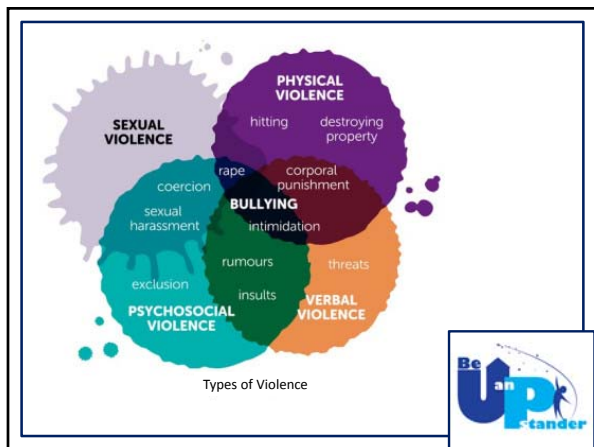
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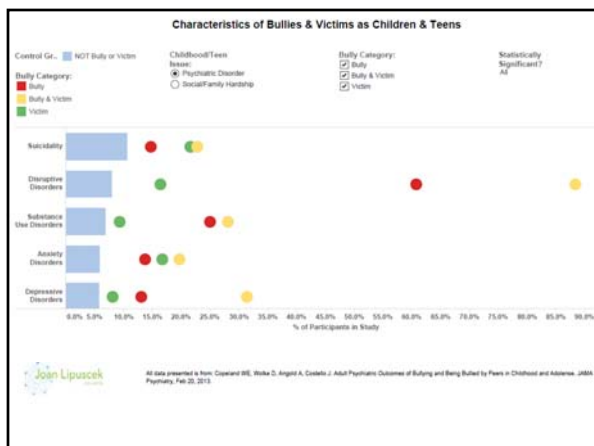
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**WHAT IS CYBERBULLYING?** Cyberbullying isn't just sending someone a snippy email.

**ANY OF THE FOLLOWING CONSTITUTES CYBERBULLYING: <sup>(1)</sup>**

- Sending mean or threatening messages to someone's email or phone.
- Spreading rumors about an individual through email, text or social media.
- Posting humiliating or threatening messages on a social media profile.
- Breaking into another person's account to send hurtful messages or pretend to be them with the intent of humiliation.
- Taking and sending unflattering or sexual pictures of a person without their consent.

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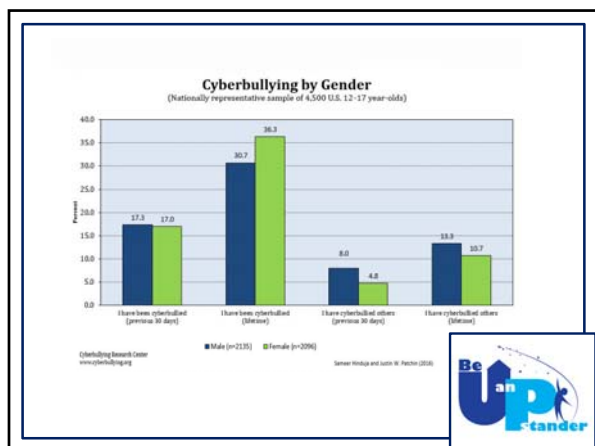
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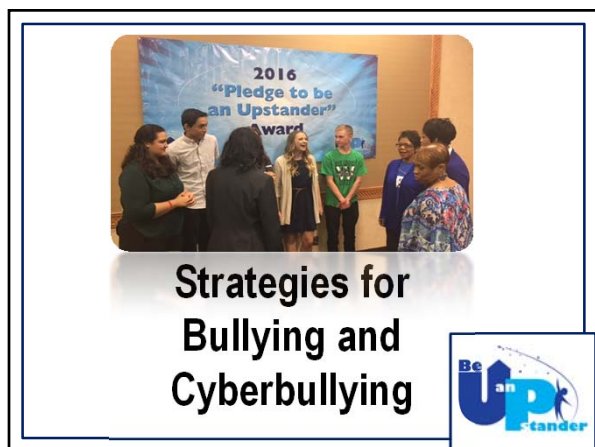
